ABOUT MALTA

Language : The language of the Maltese Islands is Maltese however almost everybody in Malta can speak and understand English.

Currency : Malta forms part of the Euro zone – local banks provide an exchange service, and there are exchange bureaus at the airport arrivals lounge

Time : GMT+1

Temperature : The weather is generally dry and arid – in Summer temperatures can be as high as 40oC and UV index as high as 10 .

Participants, especially those living in colder climates, must be made aware of these temperatures and must also be made aware of the precautions they need to take, including :-

- Wearing a sun hat at all times during the day;
- Applying sun cream to all exposed areas of the body;
- Drinking water regularly to avoid dehydration.

Clothing : It is best to wear light colours during the day together with light clothing – jeans and similar material are not ideal during sunshine hours. Temperatures at night might be cooler and it is not unusual to experience an isolated shower in August. We suggest participants pack a light water proof jacket .

Participants entitled to free emergency health care should ensure they bring a valid European Health Insurance Card.

VISAS : although most nationalities do not require an entry Visa for Malta, if you are in doubt we suggest you check out <https://identitymalta.com/who-requires-a-visa/> and advise us immediately so that we can prepare the necessary invitation and documentation. Please note that obtaining an entry Visa is the contingent's responsibility and we can only assist by providing information, invitation etc.

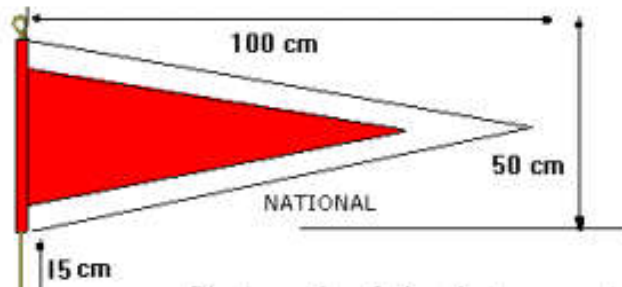
