OFFICIAL MEDJAM18 TEE SHIRT



The activities have now been selected and the programme finalised. We will be providing more information about each activity in the coming bulletins.




The morning activities will be organised every day and participants will be divided in groups so that all participants will attend all the activities organised.

The afternoon & evening activities will be attended by all participants and are intended to encourage interaction between participants from different groups and countries.


Malta Experience, Sacra Infermeria and the Wax Museum

The Malta Experience is a 45 minute long audio-visual show that tells the dramatic story of the islands' 7000 year history. Educational, informative and entertaining, the show runs through the turbulent history of a small island nation that has overcome almost unimaginable odds to survive and prosper.



Malta's Knights of St. John are famous for repelling an invasion and their military exploits abroad. But their origins were actually those of peace and caring for the sick. This noble past is revealed on a tour of "La Sacra Infermeria" (Holy Infirmary).

Built in 1574, this hospital was the most revolutionary in Europe. Its resident chemists invented a number of ground breaking treatments, such as the use of honey to treat wounds and the serving of food on silver plates to prevent the spread of bacteria. "La Sacra Infermeria's" 155 metre (508 feet) main ward was the longest in Europe. The Sacra Infermeria is now a conference centre and is partially accessible to the public with a visit to a permanent exhibition entitled 'The Knights Hospitaller' in the underground halls and corridors of the former hospital.



Esplora Interactive Science Centre

Located at Bighi, Esplora is Malta's latest visitor attraction which was officially opened on 26th October 2016. The centre seeks to cultivate a culture of scientific curiosity and imagination by igniting a passion for questioning and investigation where visitors are encouraged to explore, think and imagine.

The main exhibition halls and the landscaped gardens consists of over 200 exhibits making this science centre fun. Moreover, there is an exciting Activity Centre for visitors to experience hands-on workshops and entertaining science shows, making science relevant to our everyday lives.

Apart from the free time to roam around and discover Esplora, during this activity, participants will be challenged to conquer a quest in the same building. Another attraction will be an interactive show named weatherology.



Splash and Fun Water Park

Spend the day enjoying any of the 6 waterslides including a Super Bowl, the Black Hole, the Slide Winder, Dive Pool, Kamikaze or the 60 meter long wave pool, or simply float down the Lazy River. Whether you're a daring adventurer or you prefer to lie back, relax and go with the flow, there's something for everyone.

The Park contains no less than four pools of varying sizes, for a total water volume of 2,500,000 litres. With the exception of the Children's Splash Land pool, all of the pools use seawater that is pumped from the clean Mediterranean Sea through shore wells. All the pools are equipped with an independent water circulation and filtration system to ensure that the water is clear and sanitized. The water circulation rate is such that all the water passes through the pool filtration systems at least once every 3 hours. The filtration system ensures that the water remains crystal clear and enhances the effectiveness of the chlorine that is added to the water for disinfection purposes.

Cleanliness and sanitation are strictly controlled and authorized by the Department of Public health, who regularly carry out inspections.

All health and safety precautions are adhered to, thus to ensure total safety for both visitors as well as staff, and a First Aider is present at all times.



ABOUT MALTA

The sea around the Maltese Islands is well known for its crystal clear blue colour and no visit to Malta would be complete without at least a dip in the Mediterranean Sea. The campsite is located within walking distance from two of the Island's popular sandy beaches.

Golden Bay is a beautiful sandy beach set within the cliff face just a 5 minute walk away from the campsite. The sand at Golden Bay is light cream colour with fine clean corns. The blue sea and the cliffs surrounding the bay provide an excellent setting for spectacular sunsets.



Ghajn Tuffieha Bay, sometimes called Riviera, is another sandy beach adjacent to Golden Bay.. It is further away from the campsite and is only accessible via a steep flight of 200 stairs from the car park, which can be demanding to climb during the summer months. Ghajn Tuffieha is smaller, more unspoilt than Golden Bay, which makes the beach extra popular with locals and tourist visiting Malta, who want to enjoy the sun and the sea in a peaceful, relaxing environment.

Both beaches are safe for swimming but experience strong currents when the wind blows from the northwest, therefore swimmers should be careful and check the coloured flags that are used to inform swimmers if the sea is safe for swimming. Swimming is not recommended when Red Flags are displayed.

Participants will be able to visit either of these beaches during their day at camp or else in the afternoon after the morning activities.
